A By-Law of the Summer Village of Ross Haven, in the Province of Alberta, regulating the parking of vehicles within the boundaries of the Summer Village.

WHEREAS under the provisions of Section 16 of the Highway Traffic Act Chapter H7 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta 1980 and ammendments thereto, the Summer Village of Ross Haven has authority to regulate and control parking of vehicles within the boundaries of the Summer Village:

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Summer Village of Ross Haven deems it necessary and convenient to enact a bylaw regulating the parking of vehicles on highways and other areas within the boundaries of the Summer Village;

NOW THEREFORE, the Municipal Council of the Summer Village of Ross Haven, duly assembled, enacts as follows:

- 1. This bylaw shall be cited as the "PARKING BYLAW".
- 2. In this ByLaw:
 - a) "Commercial Vehicle" means a truck, trailer or semi-trailer, except a truck, trailer or semi-trailer that is owned and operated on behalf of the Summer Village.
 - b) "Highway" means any thoroughfare, street, road, trail, avenue, parkway, driveway, viaduct, lane, alley, square, bridge, causeway, trestleway or other place, whether publicly or privately owned, any part of which the public is ordinarily entitled or permitted to use for the passage or parking of vehicles, and includes,
 - (i) a sidewalk (including the boulevard portion of the sidewalk);
 - (ii) if a ditch lies adjacent to and parallel with the roadway, the ditch, and;
 - (iii) if a highway right of way is contained between fences or between a fence and one side of the roadway, all the land between the fences, or all the land between the fence and the edge of the roadway, as the case may be, but
 - (iv) does not include a place declared by the Lieutenant Governor in Council not to be a Highway.
 - c) "Owner" means any person registered as owner or renting a motor vehicle or having the exclusive use of it under a lease or otherwise for a period of more than 30 days;
 - d) "Parking Control Officer" means any person or persons appointed by the Summer Village Council to administer the provisions of this bylaw;
 - e) "Trailer" means a vehicle so designed that it may be attached to or drawn by a motor vehicle and intended to transport property or persons and included any trailer that is designed, constructed and equipped as a dwelling place, living abode or sleeping place, either permanently or temporarily, but does not include machinery or equipment used in the construction or maintenance of highways;
 - f) "Truck" means a vehicle designed primarily for the transportation of property or equipment but does not include a chassiscab, crawler mounted vehicle, trailer machinery or equipment used in the construction or maintenance of highways;

- g) "Truck Tractor" means a truck that is designed primarily for drawing another vehicle and that is not designed to carry any load other than part of the weight of the vehicle drawn, and includes a vehicle that is designed to accommodate a 5th wheel coupling;
- h) "Vehicle" means a device in, on or by which a person or thing may be transported or drawn on a highway.
- 3. No owner or operator of a commercial vehicle shall park or permit the Commercial Vehicle to be parked on any Highway within the Summer Village except as specifically authorized under this bylaw.
- 4. No owner or operator of a Commercial Vehicle shall park the Commercial Vehicle in any area within the Summer Village other than on private property unless a permit has been issued by an official of the Summer Village authorized to do so permitting the parking on such terms and conditions as may be contained within the permit.
- 5. No owner of a Motor Home, Trailer or Vehicle equipped for eating and sleeping shall park the aforementioned vehicles anywhere in the Summer Village except on private property.
- 6. The parking control Officer of the Summer Village may place on a Commercial Vehicle parked in contravention of this bylaw a parking tag in the form prescribed by the Summer Village requiring the payment of a fine to the Summer Village in lieu of prosecution for any contravention of this bylaw.
- 7. Any person contravening any provision of this bylaw shall be guilty of an offence and liable upon summary conviction to a fine of \$25.00.
- 8. If the person fails to pay the fine set out in the parking tag within the time provided the Parking Control Officer may issue a summons by means of a Violation Ticket.
- 9. The Violation Ticket shall be in the form prescribed by Alberta Regulation 193/82, as amended, being the Violation Ticket Regulation passed pursuant to the Summary Conviction Act, Revised Statutes of Alberta 1980 Chapter S-26.
- 10. Any Vehicle parked in violation of this bylaw may be towed and impounded by the Parking Control Officer and the Vehicle shall not be released to the owner until the towing, storage and other reasonable costs of the Summer Village have been paid by the owner.
