

SUMMER VILLAGE OF ROSS HAVEN

BYLAW NO. 131

WHEREAS, the Highway Traffic Act, Chapter H-7 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta, 1980, Section 14, (2), (8) and Section 16(1) and Section 16(2) empowers the Village Council to pass bylaws dealing with the regulation, control and management of vehicle, animal and pedestrian traffic; AND WHEREAS Section 14, (2) and (8) in part read as follows:

"With respect to highways subject to its direction, control and management the council of an urban area, by by-law, may prescribe a maximum speed of less than 50 kilometres per hour for all or any part of the highway."

"When speed limits are prescribed pursuant to this section the council or person fixing the speed limit shall cause to be erected along the highways signs indicating the speed limits so prescribed."

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Summer Village of Ross Haven, in the Province of Alberta, hereby enacts a Bylaw to regulate the speed of vehicle traffic on all highways in the Summer Village of Ross Haven.

1. The maximum speed on any highway in the Summer Village of Ross Haven is 30 kilometres per hour.

2. All previous Bylaws prescribing the maximum speed of vehicles in the Summer Village of Ross Haven are hereby rescinded.

3. Every person who contravenes a Section of this Bylaw is guilty of an offence and shall forfeit and pay the fine prescribed by law.

This Bylaw takes effect on the day of the final passing thereof.

Read the third time in Council and duly passed this 9th day of JANUARY, 1996.

NOTE: In this Schedule, "low pressure distribution pipeline" means a distribution pipeline which is designed to operate or is intended to be operated at a pressure of 700 kilopascals or less;
"high pressure pipeline" means a distribution pipeline which is designed to operate or is intended to be operated at a pressure in excess of 700 kilopascals;
"dam" means a barrier constructed for the purpose of enabling the storage of water or water containing any other substance for a storage capacity of 25 acre feet or more and that is at least 2 metres in height when measured vertically to the top of the barrier.

Provincial Offences Procedure Act
PROCEDURES AMENDMENT REGULATION

Filed: February 8, 1990
Made by the Lieutenant Governor in Council (O.C. 56/90) pursuant to section 41 of the Provincial Offences Procedure Act.

- 1 The Procedures Regulation (Alta. Reg. 233/89) is amended by this Regulation.
- 2 Section 5(2) is repealed.
- 3 Schedule 2, Part 6 is amended
 - (a) by repealing items 90 to 98, and 159 to 161;
 - (b) in items 147, 148 and 149 by striking out "75" in column 2 and substituting "150".
- 4 Schedule 2 is amended by adding the following after Part 6:

PART 6.1
HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ACT
(speeding offences)

- 1 The specified penalties payable in respect of contraventions of sections 70(1) to (6), 71(1), 72(2) to (4) and 108(3)(a) are those set out in the Table in this Part.
- 2 Proceedings with respect to a contravention of section 70(1) to (6), 71(1), 72(2) to (4) or 108(3)(a) may be commenced by a violation ticket issued under either Part 2 or Part 3 of the Provincial Offences Procedure Act.
- 3 Where a person exceeds the speed limits referred to in sections 70(1) to (6), 71(1), 72(2) to (4) and 108(3)(a) by more than 50 kilometres per hour, the person is required to appear before a justice without the alternative of making a voluntary payment.

Alberta Regulation 34/90
Municipal Government Act
DRAINAGE PROJECT AUTHORITY REGULATION

Filed: February 8, 1990

Made by the Lieutenant Governor in Council (O.C. 59/90) pursuant to section 10(1) of the Municipal Government Act.

- 1 In this Regulation,
 - (a) "drainage project" includes
 - (i) a ditch or a drain,
 - (ii) storm sewer drainage facilities,
 - (iii) works to deepen, straighten, widen or clear obstructions from or to otherwise improve a stream, creek or watercourse,
 - (iv) works to lower the water of a lake or pond,
 - (b) "municipality" means a city, town, village or summer village.

2 The council of a municipality may authorize a drainage project to be undertaken as a local improvement and the provisions of the *Municipal Taxation Act* relating to local improvements apply as though the drainage project were a local improvement referred to in that Act.

Alberta Regulation 35/90

Municipal Government Act
POST OFFICE OPERATION AUTHORITY REGULATION

Filed: February 8, 1990

Made by the Lieutenant Governor in Council (O.C. 60/90) pursuant to section 10(1) of the Municipal Government Act.

- 1 In this Regulation,
 - (a) "municipality" means a city, town, village or summer village;
 - (b) "post office" includes any place, receptacle, device or mail conveyance authorized by Canada Post Corporation for the posting, receipt, sorting, handling, transmission or delivery of mail.
- 2 The council of a municipality may contract with Canada Post Corporation to establish and operate a post office for the collection, transmission and delivery of messages, information, funds and goods as authorized by Canada Post Corporation within the municipality where a post office is not otherwise available.

Public Highways Development Act
PRIMARY HIGHWAYS DESIGNATION
AMENDMENT ORDER

Filed: February 12, 1990

Made by the Minister of Transportation and Utilities pursuant to section 3(1) of the Public Highways Development Act.
