

BYLAW NO. 226-09

SUMMER VILLAGE OF ROSS HAVEN

This is a Bylaw of the Summer Village of Ross Haven, in the Province of Alberta, to authorize the several rates of **Taxation** imposed for all purposes, for the year 2009.

WHEREAS, the total requirement of the Summer Village of Ross Haven, in the Province of Alberta, as shown in the 2009 budget is as follows:

• Municipal General	\$158,615
• ASFF Residential	\$ 95,928
• ASFF Non-Residential	\$ 1,631

WHEREAS, the total assessment of lands, buildings and improvements is 57,888,860; of which \$498,540 is non-residential, and

WHEREAS, the estimated revenue from other sources, is \$75,091; and from a Special Tax is \$81,751, and from a Wastewater Lagoon Tax is \$29,125 and

WHEREAS, the rates hereinafter set out are deemed necessary to provide the amounts required for municipal and school purposes, after making due allowance for the amount of taxes which may be expected to remain unpaid;

NOW THEREFORE, by virtue of the power conferred upon it by the Municipal Government Act, R.S.A. 2000, Chapter M-26, section 353 up to and including 370, the Council of the Summer Village of Ross Haven, in the Province of Alberta, enacts as follows;

The Municipal Administrator is hereby authorized and required to levy the following rates of taxation on the assessed value of all lands, buildings and improvements as shown on the assessment - tax roll.

• Municipal Mill Rate	2.74 mills
• ASFF Residential Rate	1.67 mills
• ASFF Non-Residential Rate	3.27 mills

THAT, the foregoing rates are to be levied in full on all property pursuant to the Municipal Government Act, R.S.A. 2000, Chapter M-26, section 297.

THAT, this bylaw shall come into force and effect upon the third reading and passing thereof.


