14 Jan 2026 – Mayor and Reeve’s Meeting

I attended this meeting in place of Ray. Several topics were discussed. This was a pre-meeting for the Regional Municipalities Meeting being held on January 30th.

- Should we look at the viability of a Regional Police Force. The province seems to be pushing us in that direction. Grants may be available to complete such a study.
- Should the region follow the provincial guidelines on dual dispatch in the case of Delta level calls for vehicle collisions on Hwys 43 & 633. Freedom of Information requests have shown that this is not the case. Why?
- There is an effort to have AHS house an ambulance in Onoway.
- Inter-Municipal Collaboration Frameworks need to be completed by March 2027.
- Safety Mitigation for proposed gravel pit on 544 just south of Onoway on the east side of Hwy 43.
 - o Anticipated to have over 350 big trucks per day entering Hwy 43. What can be done to make this safe?
 - o There are concerns about the watershed and underground water reservoirs.
- East End Bus funding is short and we may see increases. (Currently about \$7500.00 short).

17 Jan 2026 – SVLSACE Meet & Greet

The Summer Villages of Lac Ste Anne County East (SVLSACE) hosted a meet and greet. It was an opportunity for Councils to meet one another. Many Councilors are newly elected. It was an excellent opportunity to network with fellow summer village elected officials.

21 Jan 2026 – SVREMP Agency Meeting

I attended the Agency meeting in my new role as the Chair of the Advisory Committee. Our Deputy Director of Emergency Management, Greg King, was also in attendance. Our Director of Emergency Management, Noel Tomm, could not attend due to illness.

The new Regional Director of Emergency Management, Stephen Wright, was introduced to the group. He is replacing the outgoing RDEM, Janice Christiansen.

The Emergency Activation Call Out Process was discussed along with the process of declaring a SOLE (State of Local Emergency).

A small table top exercise was held and all in attendance had an opportunity to go through the an emergency situation.

There will be a regional exercise coming in March (16, 17, & 18) to stage a mock disaster. This is part of the provincial required training exercises.

Hazard and Risk Assessments will be scheduled with each Summer Village.

27 Jan 2026 – SVREMP Executive Meeting

The SVREMP Executive met to go over contract renewals for SVREMP paid staff. Contracts were gone through and additions, deletions, and corrections were made to better reflect the current requirements of the organization. As had been decided by the last Advisory Committee meeting, no increases to salary would be made for this calendar year.

30 Jan 2026 – Regional Municipalities Meeting

I attended this meeting on behalf of Ross Haven Council. There was a very full agenda.

- A report was given by each of the local RCMP detachments to bring us up to speed on crime statistics and local initiatives by the detachments.
- A presentation was given by the Rural Alberta Sports Association (RASA) discussing a possible modern new multi-sport complex to be built on the south side of Alberta Beach. It is to have a roof height of 75 feet so that it can house national level sporting events. Things are in the planning stages at this time.
- Ste. Annes Gas Co-op (SANG) gave a presentation on their present state.
- Northern Gateway Public Schools (NGPS) presented on how the schools in the area were doing.
- The Regional Mock Emergency Management Exercise was mentioned (16 – 18 March).
- Beaver dams between Lake Isle and Lac Ste. Anne were discussed. At this time, they will not be removed unless farm lands are being affected.
- The Provincial PFM (Police Funding Model) was discussed. It is being looked at for renewal and one of the key changes could be a charge per call. Areas that have more frequent requests for service, more crime reporting being done, or more police interventions would pay a higher fee.
- The idea of a Regional Police Service was discussed because the province appears to be moving in that direction. It was asked that individual Councils discuss the topic.
- Regional advocacy for an ambulance to be stationed in Onoway was brought forth. The Town of Onoway may request a letter of support from our Council.
- The Heidelberg Gravel Pit was discussed (just south of Onoway). There are concerns of highway/roadway safety.
- There was an update on Onoway Regional Medical Clinic (ORMC). Concerns were raised that there has not been an official Board meeting. What is happening with the clinic?
